Dear FairPoint Employee:

We'd like to update you on the pending merger with Consolidated Communications. Since the December announcement, our teams have been working to secure regulatory and shareholder approvals. We are pleased to report we are making solid progress on all fronts and continue to target closing on the merger mid-2017.

We received clearance related to our Hart Scott Rodino filing, which reviews anti-trust implications of the transaction and is reviewed by the Federal Trade Commission and Justice Department.

We have completed all required filings with the Federal Communications Commission and have merger approval from three of the 11 states that require a regulatory review.

As publicly traded companies, we also need the approval of the majority of our respective shareholders. We have mailed our joint proxy statement/prospectus calling for a special shareholder vote to approve this transaction. Both FairPoint and Consolidated Communications have scheduled special meetings on March 28, 2017.

We are unified in our goal to make this merger seamless for our customers.

It is only natural to wonder how this merger will affect you. While it is too early in the process to share specifics, we have teams starting to work on integration plans and we look forward to sharing more details in the coming months.

Consolidated Communications has a long history of stability and innovation, and is committed to providing customers reliable products and services. The Company has a successful track record of growth by acquisition, with expertise in integrating companies while applying best practices. We are excited about our collective potential, and what it means for our combined customers, along with the opportunity to leverage a stronger financial position and scale that comes with this combination.

This planned business combination brings together two companies with advanced networks and complementary business strategies, resulting in a financially strong business and broadband solutions provider.
